

The NRS Young investigator Travel Grant enabled me to attend the ENETS congress, which took place in Krakow, Poland. This congress focuses on neuroendocrine tumors and was divided into clinical science and basic science sessions. The focus of my research is mainly on pulmonary carcinoids, and during this congress I was able to see presentations and speak with fellow researchers about this topic. In addition, I attended presentations focusing on other neuroendocrine tumor sites, which really expanded my knowledge. My abstract '*Loss of ATRX and DAXX expression is infrequent and not associated with prognosis in pulmonary carcinoids*' was accepted as a poster presentation, and there was also a session on the research beyond ATRX and DAXX, which I found very inspiring.
